WHO WE ARE

The community council is an elected body which represents and celebrates the communities of Abbey St. Bathans, Bonkyl and



Preston and is made up of unpaid volunteers who live in the local area. Our role is to ascertain the views of our community in terms of local issues, needs and wishes and to convey those views to Scottish Borders Council and other public bodies. We are also responsible for distributing community benefit funds from the local windfarms.

WHAT WE DID

We decided that we needed to ask the people of Abbey St. Bathans, Bonkyl and Preston how the windfarm money should be spent.



A community plan was commissioned and we tried to speak to as many people as possible. Nearly 150 people enjoyed 2 open events, 143 people completed the survey which was followed up by one to one discussions and a focus group.

WHAT YOU SAID

85% of people in the area said that Abbey St. Bathans, Bonkyl and Preston is a great place to live; a third gave it a perfect 10 out of 10. The things you value most are the scenery and environment, the sense of community and that it is a great place to bring up children.

You told us that the challenges of living in the area are lack of connectivity, lack of a village shop, poor infrastructure maintenance, poor public transport, a lack of information about what is going on and too few events to get the community together.


People enjoy the green areas but are frustrated by poor maintenance of footpaths and roadside verges.

WHAT THIS LED TO



As a result of this information we have drafted a long term vision for the community of Abbey St. Bathans, Bonkyl and Preston. To enable us to deliver some of the projects identified we will establish the Preston & Abbey Community Trust (PACT) which will have charitable status.
